

# The Art of Recycling



## 2016 Sculpture Contest

*Create unique sculptures out of recycled and repurposed materials!*



### Eligibility

Any school (K-12) in Washington or Madison County may submit a sculpture; contest is limited to twenty total entries.

### Sculptures Guidelines

- ◆ Sculptures must be created and built by students.
- ◆ Must use ALL recycled or repurposed materials, with the exception of the adhesives (glue, tape, etc.) **No glass** will be allowed.
- ◆ Sculptures may not be larger than 3 ft x 3 ft x 5 ft (*w x l x h*), and must not weigh more than 50 lb. Weather-resistant is recommended but not required.
- ◆ Sculptures and a completed entry card (which will be emailed to participants after they register) must be delivered to the designated location in downtown Springdale on **Saturday, November 26**

### Judging and Awards

- ◆ Sculptures will be displayed at the *Christmas on the Creeks* celebration in downtown Springdale on the evening of November 26, 2016
- ◆ The winning sculpture will be determined by "People's Choice" and winners will be announced at the end of the night, as well as posted on the BMSWD website and Facebook page.



*Winning school receives a 100% recycled bench!*

### FAQs

#### **Who is eligible to participate?**

Any school (K-12) in Washington or Madison County is eligible. There is no limit to how many students may work as a team on a sculpture, but if a school wants to submit more than one sculpture, they should email [edeitchler@bmswd.com](mailto:edeitchler@bmswd.com).

#### **What types of materials can we use?**

Any recycled or repurposed materials are fair game *except* glass and other potentially dangerous items. You may collect from home, school, or even the Boston Mountain Solid Waste District drop-off centers in Prairie Grove or Springdale. Get creative!

#### **How long do we have to make the sculpture?**

You have until November 25 to complete the sculpture, which must be delivered to the designated location in downtown Springdale (*exact location TBD*) on **Saturday, November 26**.

#### **What will happen to the sculptures after the exhibition?**

Boston Mountain will collect the sculptures for display. If a school wants to retrieve the sculptures for display at their school, they will be able to do so in January.

#### **How will the sculptures be judged?**

The winner will be "People's Choice"; the public will be allowed to vote for their favorite sculpture during the exhibition. The winning school will win a 100% recycled bench for their school!

#### **Can you tell me about the bench?**

The 6-foot outdoor bench is made out of recycled plastic bottles and scrap tires. It is green, with a back, and black legs (*see photo*). They look great in school gardens, courtyards, or front entrances! The bench will be delivered the following week.

### **2016 Timeline**

**October 28<sup>h</sup>**: Registration Deadline

**November 26<sup>th</sup> morning**: Deliver sculptures and entry cards to downtown Springdale (*exact time and location will be emailed to participants*)

**November 26<sup>th</sup> evening**: Sculpture exhibition and judging at *Christmas on the Creeks* celebration in downtown Springdale
